Compare and group together a variety of everyday materials on the basis of their simple physical properties.

Maths

Continuation with addition and subtraction.

Place value up to 50.

Measurement

Compare, describe and solve practical problems for:

- lengths and heights [for example, long/short, longer/shorter, tall/short, double/half]
- mass/weight [for example, heavy/light, heavier than, lighter than]
- capacity and volume [for example, full/empty, more than, less than, half, half full, quarter]

Measure and begin to record lengths, heights, mass/weight, capacity and volume.
