

English: Our writing outcomes this half term include instructions, descriptions, brochures, poetry and motivational leaflets. Our writing will be inspired by the books, The Barnabus Project by the Fan Brothers and The Seed of Doubt by Irena Brignull.

Writing - Children will:

- Plan their writing by: discussing writing similar to that which they are planning to write
- Draft and write by: composing and rehearsing sentences orally
- Evaluate and edit by assessing the effectiveness of their own and others' writing
- Increase the legibility, consistency and quality of their handwriting.

Reading – Children will:

- Read books that are structured in different ways.
- Discuss words and phrases that capture the reader's interest and imagination.
- Understand what they read by drawing inferences
- Predict what might happen from details stated and implied.

Geography: The United Kingdom

- We will: locate the countries that make up the UK on a map,
- Name the capital cities of the countries of the UK; label key cities on a map; name the seas surrounding the UK and some of the main rivers,
- Explain what a county is, find Norfolk on a map and find areas of higher ground on a map of the UK,
- Explain who first settled in London and describe some ways that London has changed since AD 43,
- Identify where some immigrants to the UK came from.

Science: Light

- Recognise that they need light in order to see things and that dark is the absence of light
- Recognise that shadows are formed when the light from a light source is blocked by an opaque object –
- Find patterns in the way that the size of shadows change.
- Notice that light is reflected from surfaces.
- Recognise that light from the sun can be dangerous and that there are ways to protect our eyes.

Computing: Touch Typing

This half term, we will practice touch typing. We will learn how to use two hands to type letters on the keyboard and will understand what is meant by the home, bottom and top rows.

PE: This half term the children will be developing their co-ordination, control, fitness and teamwork skills by playing football and cricket. PE is taught by Mr Stocker.

Maths

We will be following the White Rose Maths scheme.

Multiplication and Division

- Count from 0 in multiples of 4, 8, 50 and 100.
- Recall and use multiplication and division facts for the 3, 4 and 8 multiplication tables.
- Write and calculate mathematical statements for multiplication and division using the multiplication tables they know.
- Solve problems, including missing number problems, involving multiplication and division.
- Solve problems, including missing number problems, involving multiplication and division, including positive integer scaling problems and correspondence problems in which n objects are connected to m objects.
- Write and calculate mathematical statements for multiplication and division using the multiplication tables they know, including for two-digit numbers times one-digit numbers, using mental and begin to teach a formal written method for multiplication (column method).

Design Technology: Our focus this half term is textiles. We will recap simple sewing techniques before learning how to cross stitch. We will plan our own designs then create them on bookmarks using all of the techniques we have practiced.

PSHE and PATHS: This half term, we will learn about ways we can look after our physical and mental health. We will also think about our rights and responsibilities when part of a community. We will ask the questions:

- Why do we have rules and laws in wider society?
- Why is it our responsibility to always challenge stereotypes?
